## **B. INSTRUCTIONS**

### **Eligibility**

The board serves only those persons who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open only to local licensed preachers, district licensed ministers, local licensed deacons, and district licensed deacons. Such qualifications are listed in the 2009-2013 *Manual* and the *Handbook for Christian Ministries*.

### **Mode of Study**

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college or university and, if possible, the Nazarene Theological Seminary. Other modes are the Nazarene Bible College On-line, Northwest Nazarene University On-line, or module and intensive courses taught on the district.

All modes of study are under the immediate supervision of this district studies board.

The modular course of study is in the *Handbook for Christian Ministries*, and can be downloaded at [www.nwonaz.org](http://www.nwonaz.org).

### **Instruction for Enrollment**

1. The pastor of the enrollee shall send a letter of recommendation to the district superintendent, accompanied by the Ministerial Studies Board Enrollment Form completed and signed by the applicant and the pastor. A copy of the interview guidelines completed by the local pastor should accompany the letter of recommendation.
2. A copy of the enrollment form is to be sent to the secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board.
3. Upon approval by the district superintendent information will be forwarded to the secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board, and a letter of verification will be sent to the new enrollee.

4. The District Ministerial Studies Board enrolls the candidate and gives guidance to the pastor and new enrollee relative to the ministerial course of study.
5. Licensed local ministers attending one of the Nazarene institutions of higher education will be required to inform both the pastor of the local church and the District Ministerial Studies Board, of their status: (a) by providing transcripts of courses completed and (b) the current subjects being studied.
6. Any change of address or status is the responsibility of the student and should be reported to the secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board.
7. The local church is encouraged to provide each new enrollee with a copy of the *Handbook for Christian Ministries*, which can be downloaded at [www.nwonaz.org](http://www.nwonaz.org).

### **Modular Course of Study Regulation**

1. Each student is instructed to download a copy of the *Handbook for Christian Ministries* in order that he/she may become familiar with the details of the entire program. This can be downloaded at [www.nwonaz.org](http://www.nwonaz.org).
2. Students not attending one of the Nazarene institutions of higher education should plan to attend modular course of study classes offered on the district. Each class is \$70. Dates, class names, registration, and location information can be found at [www.nwonaz.org](http://www.nwonaz.org).
3. Due dates for all assignments for modular courses are as follows. Weekend modular intensive course assignments are due 3 months after the last day of class. Assignments for modular courses that are taught over a 10 to 13 week period are due two weeks after the last class. The deadline to receive credit for courses taken during the 2011-2012 church year is February 28, 2012.
4. Students must complete at least two modular courses a year.
5. Students have 10 years from the date of their first district minister's license to complete the modular course of study.
6. Candidates should be prepared to appear for an interview as called upon by the Ministerial Studies Board at any time during the assembly year. All enrollees must attend the mandatory interview with the District Ministerial Studies Board. This meeting will take place in early April, 2012.
7. All college transcripts are to be sent to the secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board at the end of each semester or trimester or quarter to allow for a continual evaluation of the full-time college student.

### **Vital Information**

1. The Ministerial Studies Board can only go by information received from or credited by the college, university, seminary, or institutions attended or by grades received through the modular course of study. Therefore, it is important that an updated transcript of completed work in the college, university, seminary, or institution attended be sent each semester to the secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board.
2. Students who have not sent a transcript or completed two module courses during the year will be placed on probation. Students who have not sent a transcript or completed any work in the Modular Course of Study for a period of two years will be dropped from the Ministerial Studies program.
3. Current tracks of study include Elder, Elder-New Start, Elder-Chaplaincy, Elder-Compassionate Ministry, Deacon-Children's Ministry, Deacon-Youth Ministry, and Deacon Music.
4. It is necessary that each student keep the secretary informed of change of address, change of email address, or status.

### ***IV. Daily Proceedings***

The Fifty-second Annual District Assembly of the Northwestern Ohio District Church of the Nazarene was held June 7-8, 2011. Dr. Larry D. Hamilton read the certificate of ordination to the congregation. Dr. Duarte presented the new elders to the congregation. Rev. Mike Williams from MVNU presented the ordinands with a gift from the University. Rev. Kunselman gave instructions for the reception to follow the service. He then delivered the benediction.

The service closed with the recessional of "The Church's One Foundation."

The 2011 District Assembly stood adjourned.

A reception was held for the ordinands in the Lighthouse Camp and Conference Center activity center.

## V. REPORTS

### A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

#### 1. DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Friends,

Like most of you I had a birthday since last district assembly. But this wasn't just another birthday – this was one of those special, "end in 0" years. This was one of those in which card-makers and card-senders seem to delight in elaborating upon the recipient's diminishing faculties. I received similar cards ten years earlier. But I knew this one must be a landmark occasion when six months prior to the big day the AARP started sending me cards of congratulations, welcoming me as one of "them".

Today we reflect on our fifty-second year as the Northwestern Ohio District Church of the Nazarene and prepare for our fifty-third. We celebrate the life of God in His people. In reading pastors' reports, reviewing statistical data, recounting shared district ministries and experiences we figuratively give "high-fives" and fist bumps "for the Lord has done great and mighty things, and it is glorious in our sight." Allow me to share a few of the **ACHIEVEMENTS** both from local churches and the Lord's blessing upon our combined efforts.

We celebrate the growth of churches resulting in new and/or expanded facilities. Spencerville has a nice new fellowship center. Good Shepherd moved from rented facilities into a building of their own which they have completely and beautifully renovated. Upper Valley constructed a big worship center that will seat several hundred to accommodate their growing family. For several of our churches this was a year of fruitful growth. Worship attendance leading gainers include Napoleon moving above the 400 hundred mark with a gain of 51, Quest Community: plus 42; Upper Valley: plus 30; and Marysville and Toledo Northpoint with increases of 23. Let's congratulate these churches! Unfortunately, despite these fine gains and others we report a decline of 184 in primary worship attendance. This year on average 9108

persons gathered each Sunday for worship in Nazarene churches large and small across our district.

Our leading church for receiving New Nazarenes into membership was Spencerville with 21. That's notable and celebratory for a church with (until recently) a bi-vocational pastor and in a town of 2200 counting people, dogs, and cats. Worship attendance in Spencerville has increased from 17 in 2003 to 98 this year. As a whole we received 248 New Nazarenes into the fellowship of our churches. While we celebrate the lives represented by this figure, I think we all know that it can be, and I say by faith, will be far more this year and those that will come. The process of becoming a member of the Church of the Nazarene, rightly done, can be an effective means of discipleship as well as a testimony to such.

We rejoice in the report of 722 conversions. Sharing the saving gospel of Jesus Christ is always our first mission, and nothing in the world is any better than partnering with our Lord in His mission to seek and save those who are lost.

Lima Community baptized 142 new believers this year. As a whole our pastors baptized 398 persons as witness of their faith in Jesus Christ. What celebrations these are!

This year we closed three churches: New Life in West Jefferson, Springfield Grace, and Jackson Center. On the happy side our two church-type missions Quest Community and Emmaus Road show healthy increases. Quest is no longer receiving district funding, and is presently averaging about 150 week in attendance.

We celebrate the generosity of our churches. Each year our general church selects a project for Nazarene Vacation Bible Schools to support. This last year funds were designated for ministries to street children around the world. Of the hundreds of churches that participated the largest offering in the denomination was from Olathe, Kansas College Church. You might have heard of it. They gave \$4711. The second largest offering was from here in Northwestern Ohio. With an average Sunday worship attendance of 68 Kenton Nazarenes gave \$4,491!!! All told Northwestern Ohio was the second leading district in giving for this worthy cause. That's fantastic!

Many of our NWO churches have faithfully, even sacrificially, contributed to see "all budgets paid in full" not just for years, but for decades. They have been the backbone of this district; they have been the reason a fledgling college could get out of the ground here in our own state and today be a tremendous Christian university. These have been the churches that have provided pensions that mean so much to our retired ministers and spouses. And these have been the churches that supplied the fuel that has resulted in the phenomenal growth of the Church of the Nazarene in world mission areas. You know who you are, and thank you, thank you, thank you for your faithfulness and even sacrifice.

However, along the way churches can hit walls that can knock the breath out of them. If not careful these experiences can foster a "we can't do that mentality" along with a "loser's limp" as supporting evidence. Often this translates into a lack of support of ministries beyond their own churches. When this mindset develops things can go from bad to worse. This is not an easy

trend to reverse. So allow me to congratulate a few churches that had found themselves in hard places for a variety of reasons over last few years but overcame that adversity and this year, for the first time in several years, are reporting budgets paid in full: Bowling Green with Pastor Joel Nichols, Grover Hill with Pastor Jon Hoagland, Toledo Northpoint with Pastor Steve Salyers, and Wauseon with Pastor Tim Moebs. I am so proud of our district for exhibiting this generous, big picture, “we want to be team players” kind of spirit and determination.

Now, catch this! With the new general level Funding the Mission system in place Northwestern Ohio Nazarenes gave \$726,467 for the World Evangelism Fund. This was \$95,000 above our goal and translates to a payment of 113.94%. Wow!! Well over half of our churches *overpaid* their World Evangelism Fund including percentage leaders New Carlisle, Wauseon, and Fort Recovery, all which nearly met or exceeded 200% payment. In actual dollars Springfield first overpaid their WEF target by \$21,000. Similarly, we contributed 103% (\$239,030) of our Pensions and Benefits goal, 98% (\$285,704) of our MVNU goal. Then in what looks to be the best year in percentage payment ever as a district our local churches contributed 95% of our District Ministries Fund goal. Because of this high percentage received we are able to hold the bottom line on budget allocations to last year’s level, and almost \$50,000 *less* than four years ago. Good things happen for everyone when everyone shares and supports. All of this is worth noting, congratulating and celebrating!

But we didn’t just send our money. Last summer 190 Northwestern Ohio Nazarenes participated in a seven-week Work and Witness project in Cherokee, North Carolina. Thank you to Mel Miller for his leadership in this great event. Likewise the Gamertsfelder Center in Thome, Jamaica was dedicated this spring. The prayer chapel in this marvelous holistic ministry center facility was named for our Mount Sterling Church in appreciation of the Work and Witness teams it has sent there for ten consecutive years. Quest Community, only four years itself, also sent a team to the same site. Similarly, Findlay First sent another strong Work and Witness team to Haiti.

Meanwhile back at home we were having children’s and youth camps. In 2010 we had our first-ever Primary Camp with 49 campers. The three children’s camps registered an increase of one-third over what we had been enrolling in recent years. Our leading church in sending children and teenagers to camp this last year was Upper Valley with 49 campers. Churches exceeding ten percent of their Sunday worship attendance in campers were Bradford, Celina, Toledo Northpoint, and Wauseon. I think a minimal goal of total campers at children’s and youth camps should be 5% while aiming for 10% of your Sunday morning attendance. Thank you to camp directors Missy Sipes, Crystal Burgel, Mona Kunselman, and Josh Morgan.

Here is something else to celebrate. Today Northwestern Ohio will become the first district in our denomination to have an endowed scholarship fund at Nazarene Theological Seminary. It is my hope that many of our young men and women called into Christian ministry from NWO will enroll at NTS, and that by the scholarships that will be offered through this fund we will exhibit our support of them. Too many of our young pastors are coming out of school with too much debt that is often a real burden to them and even prevents many of them from entering the ministry upon graduation. I ask our lay persons, pastors, and local churches to consider adding to this endowment.

NYI has had a very fine year with a variety of purpose-driven ministries and events. NWO Teen Bible Quizzers lead the way by finishing first in our region in May 2010 which is officially in the year for which I am reporting. Last month we were in the finals again, but lost in overtime. NWO is a perennial powerhouse on the East Central Region having finished no lower than the second for 11 consecutive years. Thank you Teresa Borton and the host of Bible quiz coaches who are seeking to make young Timothy's "study(ing) to show themselves approved by God." (Oh, and the young man who answered the question that won it for NCO this year is moving from their district next week. Guess to where? Northwestern Ohio!) Likewise we salute and genuinely regard our Children's Quizzing program that plants God's Word in a child's mind and heart.

Let's talk Lighthouse Camp and Retreat Center for a few minutes. As you know this year we had a fire on the camp grounds. The maintenance building and *all* of its contents were a total loss. This has required extra labor for all of our staff, especially Camp Manager John Dodds and our Assistant District Superintendent Larry Fox. While John has been trying to replace equipment, Larry has completed mountains of paperwork, spent many, many hours on the telephone and writing letters to our insurance company. Just last week we received the first half payment for the building replacement. Hopefully this project will be completed by late summer. Despite this devastating setback our primary maintenance dynamic duo, Mark Dodds and Aaron Dodds, has stayed on task. They have been assisted by a large corps of volunteers both through our Work and Fellowship Weeks and others who have served for up to a month at a time.

If you will look at the treasurer's report for Camp Development you will see an *impressive* list of improvements and renovations here on the campgrounds these last twelve months. I especially encourage you to stop by "the long building" on the southeast corner of the grove. This was among the worst looking buildings on the campus. Today it is the nicest with four very attractive motel-type rooms. It is first-class and is available for retreats, assembly, camp meeting, family reunions, staff and board retreats, and other events. With the continued and hastened renovation or removal of unsightly buildings the appearance and capability of the camp is rapidly improving.

Furthermore, it is an achievement of epic proportions to report that the proposed allocation for the camp from the District Unified Budget is *one-half* of what it was three years ago. Truly this is remarkable. However, it has not been easy or without pain to get us to this point. The year ahead will be a tightrope to walk with even less unified budget funding. I continue to ask for your prayers, good will, and yes, your financial support and investment. I especially wish to express appreciation for the spirit of our camp staff as we have made these adjustments.

It is here I share three more significant matters with you related to the camp. First, at the end of this summer's camping season Rev. John Dodds will be concluding his service as Camp Manager, a position he assumed twenty-seven years ago. While I will try during camp meeting to more appropriately assist us in expressing our appreciation to John I want you to know how grateful I am to him for his devotion to and passion for providing a safe haven for thousands of persons who are on these grounds each year. By listening to stories from a variety of sources I

have gained a minds-eye picture of from where this camp has come and the myriad of improvements during the last near three decades. John Dodds has been here for it all.

This leads to the second matter. The Camp Manager's job has expanded greatly over the years from primarily being caretaker/maintenance to much more. In light of this the District Advisory Board has decided that moving forward we will restructure camp oversight and administration in a manner that will divide responsibilities, save costs, while hopefully helping us to be even more effective in matters related to guest services. This is reflected in the proposed camp budget.

The third significant announcement is that by the recent recommendation of the Camp Board and the enthusiastic approval of the District Advisory Board construction will begin this fall on a brand new 8500 square foot dormitory/gathering facility. *This is big. This is real big!* This is a huge advancement in the quality of housing facilities we will be able to provide for our own camps and retreats as well as our guests. Furthermore, this will make the camp more market-desirable, thus providing more ministry opportunities while making the camp more financially viable and less dependent on district resources. In that we are nearing the payoff of our present indebtedness we will be able to construct and pay for this facility with little or no increase in that line item of the present camp operating budget. Of course I would much rather raise the funds and pay it off quickly. Let's make this a united district effort, shall we?

## **APPRECIATION**

These good and great things, and so many more, do not just happen. The vibrancy of local churches and district ministries is directly related to people. People that thoughtfully, passionately, boldly lead and people that willingly, supportively, cooperatively offer themselves in service to Christ and His Church.

On the second page of your booklet you will find a list of district servant-leaders. They engage themselves in a variety of tasks, but all to one end and purpose. Thank you to each of these, and those who serve with them.

Allow me to publicly express my gratitude to our district office team: Rev. Larry and Sue Fox and Kathy Philips. They are so gracious, so supportive, so professional, and so insightful. Between the three of them there are decades of working in a district office. There really is little they have not seen or heard before, and yet they remain open to new ideas. In addition to their professional proficiencies they are real Christians. They love the Lord, they love His Church, and they recognize that what we are about is a spiritual endeavor requiring Divine wisdom, provision, and anointing.

And then today I wish especially to express my appreciation to our pastors. Have you ever seriously considered the breadth and depth of pastoral ministry?

Pastors preach and teach. Week after week, year after year, pastors read, write, think and pray in order to effectively proclaim the Word of the Lord. No matter what else happens during any given week pastors are always aware that Sunday is coming soon.

Pastors are caregivers and counselors. They are there in the darkest nights of our lives, and everyone else's life in your church. We call our pastors when there is sickness, death, divorce, wayward children, and so much more. They listen to us, pray for us, and cry with us. Pastors are leaders. Pastors are expected to chart a church's course, articulate vision, and rally support. They raise and manage funds, lead in building programs, hire and manage staff. On top of it all they somehow must navigate and negotiate the broad spectrum of persons and needs that

comprise a normal congregation – children, youth, young adults, middle adults, senior adults and the wide and freely offered opinions and suggestions coupled with diversities of personalities and preferences. The longer I pastored the more I felt like Gumby - stretched in every direction. Then pastors are called on to inspire and coordinate a volunteer force. In my last church one of our staff pastors had come from a corporate background. He said to me after a couple of years, “It was easier in business. If they didn’t do what I wanted I fired them.”

Pastors are evangelists. While caring for a local fellowship of believers they are building bridges to the unsaved, sharing the gospel, always looking, always seeking to lead someone else to Jesus.

All the while pastors are the targets of spiritual attack. Lest we forget “we wrestle not against just flesh and blood but against principalities, and powers of darkness in this present age”.

Because of their influence pastors are prime targets for the enemy.

Yet with all of that and more, I believe a pastor, next to being a parent, is the most revered calling in the world. Pastors, I want you to know how highly I esteem you, how I appreciate you, and how grateful the rest of us are for you. In my heart I will always be one of you. On a personal note I especially wish to thank you for your friendship. I could not have had a more receptive and supportive group of pastors to come into this role than you. When I was a young pastor I would hear Dr. Prince frequently say, “You are doing more good than you think you are.” And you are.

#### **ANALYSIS**

I have never been much of one for going to the doctor. It’s not that I am afraid, it’s just I am not sick much. However, I have decided in this golden year that I need to get some professional opinions and factual data on my state of health. Mona has been surprised if not a little impressed that I have taken it on myself to locate doctors, make appointments, and actually go. Already the dermatologist has been cutting and stitching. Next is the gastroenterologist. As many of you know there is a procedure that begins with a c and ends with a y with a lot of “o’s in between that you are to have beginning at age 50. At the preliminary visit a couple of weeks ago I was given a prescription and a description of what I would need to do in preparation. Oh!

My only reason for requesting a full physical from my medical doctor along with the aforementioned is because I want to do what I can to live a vibrant, long, and healthy life. Thus, I need to know the truth – the plain, unvarnished, truth about me today –not how I used to be, nor how I want to think I am, but how I really am now.

Being the only person in northwestern Ohio to have been in all of our churches these last two years it falls to me to make a diagnosis of our corporate NWO Nazarene health. This is a little tricky. It’s like trying to make a singular determination of health for everyone living on your block. We have fifty-five fully organized churches and two church-type missions on our district, and they are all different. Like people they are different sizes, shapes, and ages. They have histories and family trees that play into who they are today.

But here goes. As a whole we are healthy in many respects. Vital signs are stable, even desirable, in many categories. The attitudes of our pastors and lay persons for the very most part are positive. Based on the church/pastor reviews I have conducted our church boards have the utmost regard and love for their respective pastors. Our pastors are responsive to the needs of our lay persons. Very few of our churches are in “disturbance mode” and none that I know of in serious conflict. NWO churches exhibit a servant spirit toward their communities with most of our churches actively involved in ministries of compassion. As has been already noted there is generous support for ministries beyond the local church. So much is so good.

In physical health there is more to the story, however. Studies show that once we hit age thirty we begin to lose muscle mass. By forty we are losing 5% a decade, plus we start shrinking, and our metabolism slows down. And that's without smoking, drinking, or eating Big Macs! Now while there is not a one-to-one parallel similar things can be said of local churches. Unless there is intentionality we lose our strength, energy, and life. Unfortunately sometimes I see some of this in some of our local churches. Over the years some of our fellowships have become acclimated to and maybe even comfortable with diminished vitality, size, and strength, and now consider such as normal.

Corporately our district is still nearly twenty-five percent larger than it was twenty years ago as gauged by weekend worship attendance. However, during the last few years erosion has set in. While some of our churches have experienced great gains during this period too many local churches and consequently we as a district have been on a slow, slight, and if looked at through the narrow window of an annual report, nearly imperceptible decline in weekly worship attendance and members received by profession of faith. This is a sign we need give attention. Two years ago in my first report I challenged our district to some very aggressive five year goals: A district-wide growth of 25% in corporate worship attendance, 3000 new Nazarenes, and 3000 baptisms, 75% of our churches showing growth, five new fully-organized churches, five church-type missions, and ten new venues, sites, preaching points. I must admit to you that over the last two years I have asked myself, "Was I aiming too high?" "Should I not mention this anymore?" However, I have concluded that the answer is not in lowering our aim, but in raising our sights. In Jesus these things and far greater can be accomplished. These types of benchmarks are means to focus our attention upon our primary mission to go and make disciples. *And most of all we must remember that these goals are about real people – living breathing, eternity-headed people.*

While we all know northwestern Ohio doesn't have the masses moving in – the reality is that there are still a million persons within our district borders who do not have active church affiliation, there are babies born every day, there are schools filled with children and teenagers, there are moms and dads who want healthy families. There are broken people, messed-up, addicted people who need to know the power of Christ. According to surveys there are thousands and thousands who would come to our churches if someone they trusted would invite them, and there are so many who would be saved if they even had a clue about spiritual things and what is offered to them in Christ.

## **ACTION**

So what shall we do? We are in this together. In many ways our relationship to one another, and even that of the relationship of a local church and district, is covenantal. We commit in love and faith to share in this Christ-given mission with one another.

So allow me to share with you what I have been thinking and doing. This in two parts. First is the role of the district superintendent and support staff. When Dr. Cunningham called me about his desire to appoint me to this position he stated, "Geoff we would like for you to consider investing the next years of your ministry in training pastors to do the kinds of things you have been doing over the years." I wondered at the moment if that was just a nice thing to say. But then I thought Dr. Cunningham doesn't usually say things he doesn't mean.

So I came with that in mind. As announced at last year's District Assembly we commenced in November with **BIG DAYS**. These bi-monthly all day sessions are "occasions for the renewal and development of pastors." To date we have averaged 70 pastors and would-be pastors present

with an actual increase in attendance at each event. In addition to spiritual enrichment and social interaction among pastors training sessions have centered on leadership, mission, evangelism, and worship. On-district pastors with particular strengths in certain areas have made outstanding presentations. I wish I had heard some of these things when I was pastoring. As we move ahead we will seek to secure funding to provide means for other pastors and leaders from across the country to spend a day teaching in their respective strengths. It is my hope that from such NWO pastors will receive premier, current, usable, real-world training that will quicken their minds, sharpen their skills, and empower them to maximize God's call upon them. Of course, I think every pastor should avail himself or herself of these experiences. My desire this year is to create a format where our bi-vocational pastors will also have opportunity to share in experiences like these.

A second step I wish to take is helping our local churches to rightly and insightfully see themselves as they are, and then to develop meaningful measurable steps for them to become the church God is calling them to be. Over the last several months I have been reviewing and talking with professional church health consulting organizations. I am still trying to determine what is our best route forward on this.

In the meantime allow me to make a suggestion. Sometimes our instincts can at least point us in the right direction. As most of you know we distribute evaluations forms for our church boards and pastors to complete in preparation for the church-pastor reviews. These are not perfect instruments. However, they are insightful and can be useful. As I have conducted the church pastor reviews at our churches this is what I have witnessed repeatedly. Overwhelmingly our church boards rate our pastors very, very, high. At the same time these boards forthrightly note needed areas of improvement in and by their church. My fear, however, is that after these evaluations are done, that they are placed in a file, only to see that four years later there has been little improvement in important areas.

So I am asking every pastor to pull that last evaluation out of your file. Reflect on it, think about it, pray over it, take it to board meeting next month. I appreciated one pastor who stated, "This will become our agenda as we move forward."

And a third part of this covenant is for me to be available to our pastors for discussion, feedback, perspective while pastors and church leaders process issues, make decisions, take initiatives in order to be soul-winning, disciple-making, Kingdom-living, community-transforming kinds of churches. The bottom line in all of this is to see that "the district" be a resource, providing training, tools, and personnel to assist in helping local churches to succeed in their mission.

The other party in this covenant is local churches and pastors. Here is what I ask today of our pastors in this covenant, especially as it relates to the matters we are discussing.

- 1) Ask questions. I am encouraging every pastor to go home, get alone with God, and ask, "Is there anything you want to say to me about me, this church, and this community? Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." In fact I would suggest you to sincerely ask that question frequently for the rest of your ministry. We might be surprised by what happens.
- 2) Avail yourself to resources provided to you. Learn by training. Learn by getting around the right kind of people. Learn by reading. Learn by watching others. Put yourself in positions to grow.
- 3) Intentionally align and arrange, and even rearrange yourself and the church you lead with the mission of our Lord Jesus "to seek and to save those who are lost." I heard my friend, and one of my mentors, Bob Huffaker, pose one question frequently. In fact I think it would be safe to say

that this question is what transformed his ministry from being pretty good to extraordinary, “*What kind of church is it going to take to reach this kind of world?*”

Please hear me on this one. I know we live in a day where people move, and some frequently, from church to church. And we should be welcoming. The reality is that many Nazarenes even in our early days were Christians looking for a church that was preaching the Scriptures, and was alive with evangelistic passion and teaching about the Spirit-filled life. But our focus must always be first on those who are lost, unsaved, missing. When that occurs there will be professions of faith, baptisms, and growing churches – the right way, the real way. That leads me to this:

## ASPIRATION

For many years I have made it my practice to read the first chapter of Joshua on New Year’s Day. We all know the context. Moses has died. While his generation had experienced the miracle-drama of deliverance they never got to Canaan. Forty years they circled the desert with this year a lot like last year.

I have discovered that upon reaching a certain age churches and church life can become more like desert-circling than Canaan-conquering. Many churches are comfortable with such. It’s predictable, safe, and everyone knows the routine.

But it lacks passionate mission-objectives. Somewhere the Lord puts his hand on someone and says, “It’s time to move on.” And that requires fortitude. The Lord said to Joshua, “Be courageous and very strong...do not be discouraged...for I am with you.” Or put in cliff note version: “Be Bold.”

Here’s what I know about boldness. If it’s bold, it means risk. If it isn’t bold, it won’t inspire. If it isn’t bold, it probably isn’t from God. If it isn’t bold, you won’t need God.

And so today I urge you - pastors, lay leaders, delegates: Be bold. Be bold in faith. Some years back walking along in my doctrinally sound, sin-avoiding Christian life I became convicted by the words of Scripture: “*Without faith it is impossible to please God.*” I asked the Lord to forgive me, and to help me to think and live in the realm of faith. Be bold! Pastor, lay leader, be bold. Solomon was right. “Where there is no vision, the people perish.” A layman called my office recently. He meant no harm. There was no meanness in his voice or in what he said. He told me of how he loves his pastor. But then he came to the reason for his call and said, “Our church is slipping because we are without challenge. Our best days were when we were doing things people told us we would never pull off.” Be bold!

Preacher, be bold – never arrogant, never condescending, but always confident in the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Watered-down The Gospel does nothing good for anyone. But delivered full-strength it is the power of God to salvation, to transform lives and families. Preach boldly the call to righteousness, the breadth and depth of God’s grace, the summons of Jesus to a sold-out life, and the dynamic of an entirely sanctified, Spirit-filled life. Be bold!

Christian, be bold in the Spirit to take the first step in sharing the good news of Jesus. I heard Andy Stanley recently challenging his congregation to have those at least initially “awkward

conversations” with unbelievers that sometimes are necessary in opening doors. “Sow...you never know.” Be bold!

Be bold with compassion. Young-at-heart and restless friend who really wants to make a difference in the world, I urge you to act on your impulses in healing the hurts of suffering, confronting the ravages of systemic evil, delivering justice and mercy to people all over the world in Jesus’ Name. I submit to you that *there is nothing bolder than love on a mission*. Be bold!

Be bold in prayer. Claim the promises of Scripture. “Call to me and I will answer you and show you great and mighty things.” Pray for big things. Pray about things that will matter in eternity. Pray for a real spiritual awakening for your community. Be bold!

Youth pastor, children’s pastor, be bold. Shepherding a relatively small or mid-size group may be the norm, but what if God ignited you, and you ignited others about evangelizing not a few but large numbers of children and teenagers in your area? Dream it, do it. Be bold!

Boldness often requires consciously departing from the familiar but rut-worn, safe-but-die-in-the-desert patterns and practices of the past. Boldness is adapting, retooling, even changing for the sake of the mission as opposed to the personally preferred. While we Nazarenes highly esteem John Wesley for his doctrinal articulation, we sometimes pass over the pain it brought to the son of an Anglican priest to depart from the acceptable, the comfortable, the normal ways of doing ministry. As one writer put it, “The prejudices of his high-church training, his strict notions of the methods and proprieties of public worship, his views of the apostolic succession and the prerogatives of the priest, even his most cherished convictions, were not allowed to stand in the way.

“Unwilling that people should perish in their sins and unable to reach them from church pulpits Wesley as he would later state thus ‘proposed to become the more vile’ and commenced to preaching in the fields. (Then) seeing that he and the few clergymen cooperating with him could not do the work that needed to be done, he was led to approve local preachers. He evaluated and approved men who were not ordained by the Anglican Church to preach and do pastoral work. This expansion of lay preachers was one of the keys of the growth of Methodism.”

That’s bold. That’s the kind of boldness I’m talking about: **boldness in which mission trumps everything else**. Of course the whole field preaching thing was not his idea; it was borrowed from his Calvinist friend Whitefield. Sometimes boldness is the humility to ask, “Is there a better way to reach people for Christ and make disciples?” And, “What are others doing that is working?” Boldness is initiating change for the sake of Christ and His Great Cause. Boldness is saying, “I, we will not march another year in the desert circuit” and then acting, moving, leading in a manner that proves oneself sincere.

Be bold. I urge, encourage, exhort, challenge you, *and me*, to be bold. Be bold enough to lead. Be bold enough to do what you know needs to be done even when familiarity woos and security beckons. Be bold enough to say, “I don’t have to survive.” Be bold in knowing it is God who has called you.

It is my desire to lead by example. I hope throughout the years to come that you will hear things initiated from “the district” that will cause you to say, “That’s bold!” Likewise I hope the rest of us will see and hear of what you and your church are doing in mission and say, “That’s bold!”

This and I’m done. A few weeks ago I got up early on a Saturday morning. People my age do that, you know. I sat down in the recliner where I do every morning with my bowl of Fiber

One cereal – people my age eat that stuff you know – and turned on the television. If you watch television early on Saturday mornings you know that nearly every other channel is an infomercial describing either effortless exercise equipment, or miracle hair-making gels, or how to make a million dollars in ninety days with somebody else’s money. I’ve already seen all of those.

So on this Saturday morning I landed at the History Channel where they were telling a story I had never heard before about the Revolutionary War. You probably know most of the big events in the War for Independence with the names of places like Yorktown, Bunker Hill, Valley Forge, and Saratoga.

The year was 1780. The Patriots had just been badly defeated in the Battle of Charleston, followed by another big blow in the Battle of Camden. Morale was low, and support for the war was diminishing quickly. Major Patrick Ferguson, commander of the Loyalists, dispatched warnings to the mountain communities of western North Carolina and eastern Tennessee that unless they surrendered he would hang their men and burn their land and homes.

But rather than scare these mountaineers it stirred them up. With only their hunting weapons and little organization they decided they would not surrender, nor would they wait for Ferguson’s men to attack. Instead they gathered and hiked for days through the wilderness. Finally on October 7, at three o’clock in the afternoon they snuck up King’s Mountain and attacked from all sides. Within just three hours the battle was decisively and stunningly won by the Patriots. That evening Joseph Greer set off on a 600 mile expedition to notify the Continental Congress of the victory, and arrived thirty days later in Philadelphia. Greer’s report of the Patriot victory at Kings Mountain “re-energized a downtrodden Continental Congress.” Momentum swung. Courage and cause was renewed. Thomas Jefferson later described it as “the turn of the tide of success.” Within a year the war was over, and as they say, “The rest is history.”

Be bold, you young David’s. We need your vigor, fresh eyes, and exemplary faith. Be bold, you Esther’s. You have come to the kingdom for such a time as this. Be bold, you old Caleb’s. Go take that mountain that’s been on your mind for years. Be bold you transformed Saul of Tarsus – sure, you will annoy and maybe even anger some, but think how many others are just waiting for someone like you with a story like yours about a Savior like ours to show up. Be bold! Be bold, Northwestern Ohio Nazarenes!

## **2. District NMI President**

**May 7, 2011**

Rev. Kunselman, Distinguished Missionary Guests, Pastors, Delegates, Friends and Family,

It is very much a cliché’, an overused one at that, but life really is a journey. Sometimes the way is paved, sometimes it is gravel, sometimes there are potholes, sometimes brand new asphalt has been laid and the paint marking the center lines is still wet. There are hills, valleys, mountains, open fields, and the experience of all types of weather along the way. As we travel through this life, often we find ourselves walking with friends, enjoying their company and

companionship. Other days we walk alone, either at peace with the solitude or longing for a hand to hold along the way. This journey we find ourselves on is in a perpetual state of motion, compelling us to move along with it, either dragging one leg behind us or racing forward in an effort to get ahead. From the minute we are born, the journey begins and we are faced with what we will choose to do with every minute we are given along the way.

Collectively, as a district, we have spent at least part of our life's journeys together this year by participating in Nazarene Missions International as a body of believers who endeavor to minister to people around the world. In so doing, we invited several missionary families to spend time with us to share how God is using them in their respective fields. Having Missionaries with all of their children at our convention last year and then for a deputation tour was the highlight of the year! We were also blessed to share in the ministry of missionaries to Jordan and a missionary who served in the Horn of Africa. Missionaries made quite an impression while on our district, as they shared their enthusiasm for the people and ministry in Ghana. The willingness to open our churches, homes and lives to our missionaries remains a vital part of educating our congregations and encouraging personal relationships between and support for our missionaries. Please, continue to make this a priority in your churches and mission emphasis throughout each year. Our missionaries are the living, breathing connection and result of the prayers we ask people to pray, the money we ask people to give and the passion we try to ignite across our congregations. We must keep our missionaries before our people.

On our journey this year, once again, the people of the Northwestern Ohio district were faithful to collect and pack items for 1,338 crisis care kits and provide school supplies enough to fill 1,040 school pal-paks. Those are record numbers for our district! Compassionate Ministries is one area of service I never have to plead with people to invest in, and with the help of people like Clyde Lotridge who ships our CCK's and Pal-Paks for us, this task is even easier to accomplish. When a practical need is made known, we band together and do what needs to be done to meet the need. I am both grateful and proud of our efforts in this regard.

As of right now, it looks as though the Northwestern Ohio district will again, for the 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, meet its World Evangelism Goal, with some of our churches paying their budgets in full who were not able to do so last year. For this we give God thanks. The depressed economy has been a topic of my last three reports; however, even with the negative, often devastating impact of lost income, our families have given sacrificially to ensure that the needs of others were met. Even our children got involved in missions this year in creative and selfless ways so they could give to others in need. We will be hearing from a very special young man named Aiden Loggett during this convention who is a special blessing. Aiden will inspire us to be less concerned with our own wants and give more of ourselves in an effort to lessen the suffering of others.

In a changing of the guard if you will, Marianne McCord stepped into the position of Children's Mission Coordinator following the very tall order of Jon Spyker who served in that role for several years. In a combined effort, Marianne and Jon organized a fantastic day for our children to come together and learn about missions. Over 200 children participated in the event which was held here at the district center in October with a special guest missionary. The children sang, spent time listening and talking to the missionary, made crafts, ate, went on a scavenger hunt and enjoyed a video game themed skit. The children also brought their offerings for the Kids Reaching Kids project, our district children's project, raising \$10,107. The children on the Northwestern Ohio district are quite an amazing group of future leaders! As adult mentors we need to be constantly reaching toward them, loving them, training them, guiding

them, discipling them and allowing them the freedom to grow in the knowledge and grace of Jesus Christ. They cannot become the church if we do not do our part now to impart to them the wisdom and vision they need, with which to carry on our Christian heritage.

This past summer, we accomplished a phenomenal achievement in the history of Work and Witness on this district. Mel Miller organized a trip to Cherokee, North Carolina that created so much interest, we ended up taking 190 people from 18 different churches over six consecutive weeks to work and minister to the people living on the Cherokee reservation. Many of those who went were exposed to Work and Witness for the very first time. Families shared the experience together, enjoying various service projects, time with others on the district and recreational fun. Children, teenagers and adults of all ages participated in the trip serving in a multitude of ways. Many have asked when the district will be planning another event like the Cherokee trip. Well, first, we need to let Mel recover! However, it is our hope to involve as many people as possible in Work and Witness through amazing opportunities like the Cherokee trip. It was a huge success for the people of Cherokee that we were able to minister to and all from our district who participated!

As we journeyed through this year together, we looked to our leaders for answers to difficult questions and the guidance they are known to provide at a moment's notice. To Rev. Kunselman, I wish to say, "Thank you" for the leadership you have given to the NMI council through the year. You lead with humble confidence, clear vision and a consistent, contagious passion for the Kingdom. On a personal level, I want you to know how sincerely grateful my family and I are for the time you have spent building a relationship with us, especially with our children. Seth still asks if "that guy" is going to go fishing with him again. Several weeks ago when I told you that I felt I needed to step down as district president in order to devote more time to Seth's education you heard the deep sadness in my voice and said something to me that gave me great comfort. You said, "There is a district full of people who can be district president, but Seth only has one mom." I appreciated more than I can express to you, that without hesitation you put my family first before a position that needed to be filled. Thank you for your personal care and concern.

Our leadership also includes our pastors who shepherd us on a weekly, some of us on a daily basis. I rejoice and am thankful for the pastors who make NMI a priority in their churches. Even in the restructuring of Sunday and Wednesday evening services, many of you have chosen to give NMI a place by making time for promotions, emphases, offerings and deputation services. It is my continual prayer that because of your faithfulness to do so, your congregations will become increasingly mission-minded, God will expand your territories and bless you beyond measure for your efforts. Without your partnership, NMI would fail to be effective and eventually would just fail. Thank you for leading with commitment and determination.

We have AWESOME NMI presidents on this district! Our presidents work hard and often for little to no thanks for the time they spend organizing mission events in our churches. To be an effective NMI president requires an unmatched passion for missions, plain and simple. The best presidents are the ones that exude overwhelming enthusiasm that cannot be contained...that's a nice way of saying you can't get them to stop talking about the fantastic things their church is doing for missions! Let me tell you something about local presidents, they are exceptional people. To my presidents I would like to say, you are truly special to me, and I appreciate every single minute you spend igniting passion and excitement for missions among your people. Your commitment to this ministry is critical to the life and effectiveness of NMI.

Many of you know that in March I decided that I needed to step down as district president so that I could take care of my family, specifically, a need that had recently come about for one of our children. I agonized over that decision for weeks; my heart broke over the thought of leaving this behind, but my first responsibility must always be to my family, a responsibility I do not take lightly. After much prayer and seeking the Lord's will for my family, I am thrilled to tell you that God answered prayer for our family. He also showed me in all the ministries I am involved with, where my heart truly is and to what he has called me. That is missions, and serving as your district president is a huge part of that. I am grateful to God for this opportunity and for making it possible for me to continue if that be your desire.

In Mark chapter 8 verse 27, we read that while Jesus is walking down the road with his disciples he poses to them a crucial question, "Who do people say that I am?" In his commentary, Matthew Henry points out to us that Christ did not ask this question to inform himself. He asked the question of his disciples so that they would be forced to answer it for themselves and thus inform one another. They answered him by saying, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and still others, one of the prophets." The majority of people that Jesus had been ministering to were missing the truth about Christ. With a church on the vast majority of street corners in the United States of America, who do you think people say Jesus is today? I want to share with you a very telling video that will put the answer to that question in perspective for us. (Run video) The vast majority of people are still missing the truth about Christ.

The account of Mark shares with us that Jesus follows his initial question with one that delves deep into the souls of his disciples and inquires to each personally, "But what about you? Who do you say I am?" Even though they had given up their lives to follow Him, Jesus needed to be certain that they knew and believed him to be the Messiah. Each of us are accountable to answer the same question. Peter answered correctly and with sincerity, "You are the Christ". As followers of Jesus, our answer must genuinely be the same. We must know who he is so that we can share him with the people we come in contact with every day. And we absolutely must share him as he is, not how we or others may want him to be. He is a holy, loving, just God and must be presented as so without hesitation. We are on our way in this journey, but the journey will be for nothing, all of our giving, sacrificing, time, money, gifts and talents will mean nothing if we cannot answer with Peter, "You are the Christ" and willingly extend his grace and love to every single human being we encounter along the way. Whether we are traveling with one another's company or by ourselves, together, let's make this journey count. Let's endeavor to make it pleasing to God. Let's gather up as many as we can along the way to join us. Let's contribute everything we possibly can so others will know that it is Jesus Christ whom we walk this journey with and for. Let's make every single minute count for the Kingdom!

### **3. DISTRICT BOARD OF SUNDAY SCHOOL AND DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRIES INTERNATIONAL CHAIRPERSON**

Dr. Duarte, Rev. Kunselman, members and friends of this great assembly, I want to give my first report as the Northwestern Ohio SDMI Chairman.

I will never forget sitting at a meal with the two former SDMI Chairmen of our district and one of them mentioning, “Oh look, dumb, dumber, and dumbest.” I represent the end of that statement. I am not sure what that all means but I am slowly beginning to understand their words of wisdom. To think that you can harness all of the discipleship efforts on the district is simply impossible. If you try, you will only get frustrated. If you don’t try, you will only feel guilty for not trying. It is good to know that there are many capable leaders on our district that have a passion to make Christ-Like Disciples to impact the Nations from Northwest Ohio.

I want to thank those who served on our SDMI council this past year: Timothy Johnson, Joel Nichols, Cindy Crabtree, and Denise Rhodes. I also would like to thank Gloria Johnson for the great work she does as our Statistical Secretary. Missy Sipes continues to do an awesome job as our Children’s Director on the district. Rich Applegarth has done an excellent job at bringing life to our Primetime Ministry and we look forward to great days ahead.

In addition I would also like to thank our District Superintendent, Geoff Kunselman. He has a great vision as to where the Lord is leading this district and he leads with a Jesus-style. It is good to see the Lord working and restoring many people on this great district. There is a togetherness that is forming in new and fresh ways under his leadership. God is good!

Finally, I want to thank our district office staff for the long hours and tireless support they provide throughout the year. Larry, Sue, and Kathy are so gracious and efficient. Events go so well and life is much better when they are a part of the many aspects of the district ministry events.

Let me highlight a few events that took place this past year:

1. During the summer, three great Children’s District Camps. This year we added the Primary age children for a 3 day camp. All camps were fun, well staffed, and left with great momentum for this year. We want to thank all the volunteers and directors for their love and hard work.
2. In October, the Larry R. Fairbanks Memorial Golf Scramble. There were 60 golfers from around the district that enjoyed a great day with perfect weather, good food and one team enjoyed better than a perfect round of golf at 19 under par. Proceeds of \$1120.00 went toward improvements to the Lighthouse Camp and Retreat Center.
3. In February, Empower the Church Tour with H.B. London. There were over 400 signed up to come but only half enjoyed this event. The north side of the district was cancelled due to a snow storm. This year we will only have to deal with leaves instead of snow since it will be moved to end of October.

4. The Manly Man Weekend in May. This year we began to be more intentional at providing opportunities for our men to be discipled. We had 54 from our district attend this quality event. It had a Promise Keepers feel without the crowds.

Each year we recognize churches that have shown advancement and achievement in Discipleship Ministries. The first award is called the Honor Achievement Award. To receive this Award, there must be a Discipleship Ministries percentage gain of at least 1% to 9% increase in both enrollment and average attendance. The following 10 churches have achieved this award: Defiance, Fayette, Findlay First, Leipsic, Mount Blanchard, Napoleon, Quest Community, Spencerville, Union City, and Upper Valley community.

The second award is called the Superior Achievement Award. To receive this Award, there must be a Discipleship Ministries percentage gain of 10%-49% increase in both enrollment and average attendance. The following 3 churches have achieved this award: Hope Community, Marysville, and Toledo Northpoint.

This last award is called the Exceptional Achievement Award. To receive this Award, there must be a Discipleship Ministries percentage gain of 50% increase in both enrollment and average attendance. This year 1 church has achieved this award: Emmaus Road in Toledo

In its day, the Titanic was hailed as an engineering marvel – the greatest sailing ship ever built. It was thought that nothing could hurt this ship. The captain was so confident that he ignored numerous ice warnings. In fact, a computer simulation of the crash indicated there would have been less damage and loss of life if the ship had hit the iceberg head-on, instead of trying to skirt around it at the last minute.

I have seen a pattern of decline in the number of people we are discipling on Northwest Ohio. In 1976, we had 8,166 as an average Sunday School attendance on our district. This year we have a total of 5,900 in Discipleship ministries. The number is going the wrong way. Discipleship does not just happen, it has to be intentional. Intentional at praying for people to be called into the ministry of teaching Sunday School or Adult Bible Fellowship, Youth, and Children's classes... Intentional at connecting seasoned Christians with new Christians for the purpose of mentoring and discipling... Intentional at doing whatever it takes to Go and Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations... It takes work. Avoiding the collision and not hitting the issue of discipleship head on is not going to cause this issue to go away. We can deny, ignore, shift blame, focus on other things to avoid coming to the conclusion that we are not reaching as many people as we can, but the problem will still be there.

Statistics show that if we get people engaged in the Word of God 4 times a week or more, it will impact their world view, attitudinal habits, and behavioral choices. Woodie Stevens, Director of SDMI International for the church of the Nazarene says that the Barna research discovered very little difference in the lifestyle habits of those who attend church regular and those who very seldom attend at all. The Center for Bible Engagement discovered that those who read the Bible 4 times or more a week experience life differently from those who don't. We have known that fact because we read it in God's Word. Now we have scientific fact. Not that we

needed it. But the way we are imitating the captain of the Titanic in ignoring the warnings is not getting us anywhere. There is hope and healing in the balance. Reading and engaging in the word of God causes teenagers to change their habits and direction in life. With that I ask, how are you discipling your teenagers? Who are discipling your teenagers? Are you passionate about seeing God's Word transform lives? I can go to each age group of the church and ask the same question.

We need to be intentional at engaging people in the word of God.

2 Timothy 3:16

<sup>16</sup> All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> so that all God's people may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

Hebrews 4:12

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

There are some churches that have found an effective model for discipling people in their sphere of influence but I want to encourage you not to give up on the traditional time to disciple your people. In order for discipleship to happen you have to work the plan and continue to cast the vision. Sunday Morning Worship alone is not discipleship. If people are not connected to the Word of God and other followers of Jesus Christ, the back door will be as active as the front door of your church. Maybe you have done a study and experimented with other vital options and times, and you are finding a fruitful ministry. To this I commend you.

As an SDMI council, we want to help resource you and provide opportunities for you to learn and grow to be more like Christ in your model of discipleship. We really do need each other. Some have learned some valuable principles when it comes to discipleship. We want to help spread the word and help each of our churches at whatever level they may find themselves. Being a part of a team means playing different roles when we gather. In some areas you may be in need, in others you may be a resource, and in others you may be a vital networking option. No church can do everything, but every church can do something. By all means, let's help each other be all we can be.

This year has been a year of trying to figure out how we can best communicate and resource our churches to Make Christ-Like Disciples in the Nations. We truly want to be a source of strength and encouragement, a conduit of resources and out of the box thinking, and we want to provide times of networking and training. Please take the time to fill out the sheet concerning how we can communicate to your churches, provided back on the welcome center.

In closing, I want to remind you of the Mission and Purpose of Discipleship Ministries:

### **The MISSION STATEMENT**

The mission of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) is to carry out the Great Commission to children, youth, and adults in preparation for a lifetime of making Christlike disciples in the nations.

## **The PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International is fourfold:

- A. To intentionally develop relationships with unreached people until they are Christlike Disciples and making Christlike Disciples.
- B. To teach the Word of God until children, youth, and adults are saved, sanctified wholly, and maturing in Christian experience.
- C. To help Christians grow spiritually involving them in evangelism, Christian education, and disciple making.
- D. To encourage children, youth, and adults to enroll in Sunday School / small groups and faithfully attend.

We need to think about how we can be creative in fulfilling our mission and purpose in our local churches and do all that we can to make opportunities to disciple followers of Jesus Christ. I look forward to sharing the many ways that are available in this new year and growing together in order to minister the Good news to a hungry world...

## **4. DISTRICT NYI PRESIDENT**

**June 4, 2011**

Good morning. On behalf of the NYI Council Members, let me first thank you for your attendance at NYI Convention this year. It is always a treat to get together with each of you and talk about what's going on in today's Youth Ministries. This will be my fifth year serving as the District NYI President and it has been a privilege and a lot of fun. Together we've seen our program touch the lives of hundreds, if not thousands, of Northwestern Ohio teenagers and I look forward to another year of serving.

As you know, our theme this year is Momentum. And I can't really claim the creative energy behind this idea. It was more the result of witnessing Joe Proudfoot and Alex Connell's running endeavors over the last few years coupled with a book I'm reading, titled. . . Momentum. But in a single word, it captures where I think we are as a District Program. A quick search on Wikipedia tells us that in [classical mechanics](#), momentum is the product of the [mass](#) and [velocity](#) of an object. Like velocity, momentum is a [vector](#) quantity, possessing a direction as well as a magnitude. I could go on, but the truth is that I wanted to include that line in my report just to sound smart.

Momentum is something that is possessed. It is energy. It is movement.

When I first took this position, we had an 80% turnover in Youth Pastors in one year. From a programming standpoint, this put us in a position of largely starting from scratch. We had good ideas and policies set in place, and a history of strong leadership. But with the new staff, we were not exactly a classic example of having momentum. This year, I'm happy to say that all

our event and program directors not only are remaining the same, but they also have been a part of their individual event or program for an average of 3 years.

In addition to the experience we currently have on our staff, we are coming off a fantastic year. Some of you may remember the goals that were outlined at last year's NYI Convention. They were as follows:

- 10% increase in Quizzing Participation
- 10% increase in MVNU Freshman Class attendance
- Break all District NYI Event Records

I can't stand here and proclaim from the bully pulpit that we met ALL these goals, but let me tell you what we did.

Regarding event records, of our five major events last year (including upcoming NYC), 2 have increased in numbers, one stayed the same, one dipped slightly and one was completely restructured. Fall Retreat took a little dip, but still topped 300. Our biggest event, BLAST, came in about even with the previous record, at just over 600. And while the official numbers for New Year's Revolution dropped, this event may have been the biggest surprise of all. As you know NYR was completely restructured last year. Experience tells us that when this happens, it is not uncommon to see a big dip in participation. The previous record for NYR was 270 and we came in at 240.

Summer Camp was our first winner with 168 participants. This included 38 from another district. Meaning N.W.O. sent 140. The previous record was 125. Director Josh Morgan works harder and harder each year to make this event a success. In addition to an advertising program that includes handouts, flyers, a video, and multiple promotionals at other events, last year Josh recruited Mike McKenzie to help out. Together they did a fantastic job and we received nothing but positive reviews. With the excitement generated last year, we should see another big week in July.

And of course coming up in a few weeks is NYC. Admittedly, I had not originally factored NYC into the mix as I was more focused on our local events. But my good friend Brice Little took me to task just the same. In addition to the traditional advertising by mail, Brice printed up T-Shirts, Magnets, Showed up at other events, and even created our own N.W.O. N.Y.C. website portal; a place for all things NYC. And his efforts paid off. This is an expensive event, we're in a terrible economy and most other districts have seen their numbers drop. In 2007 we took 78 to St. Louis. This year. . . 89. That's a 14% increase. Any good sales manager will tell you, those are some good numbers.

Regarding MVNU, this one was harder to calculate than I expected due to all the angles involved in the recruiting process. You've got number of phone calls, how many inquiries, verbal commitments, accepted students, accepted students who have made a deposit. . . and there are still a few months before the year actually begins. That said, I've taken what I know of the sales process and made my best attempt to match the area where the NYI has the most influence – Nazarene Verbal Inquiries. The District NYI has the most impact over the first introduction of

MVNU to Nazarene teenagers. This happens at all our district events, and in our local churches. The rest is up to the actual staff of the school. Last year at this time, we had 178 Nazarene Inquiries. This year - 188. With MVNU as our Regional Nazarene School, let me take this opportunity to offer kudos to everyone in this room. This is a group effort, and we're making headway.

Finally, the one that I'm most excited about is the big jump we had in quizzing. Teresa Borton always does well, but last year made a special effort to put together a bigger recruitment press than ever before. In addition to the normal items, Teresa recruited some help to put together our own quizzing promotional video. Not only was this shown at several district events, it was also mailed out with the packets in early August. This was followed by a series of postcards sent all the way into the first few months of the quizzing season. Teresa's efforts paid off with 3 churches either getting into quizzing for the first time, or restarting an old program. Additionally we saw our first Non-Nazarene participants join us this year. The United Brethren Church from Van Wert fielded a team and the Friends Church of Van Wert sent a quizzier to join one of our district teams. Nice Job Teresa.

Another item that I'll highlight briefly is our scholarship program. We made a structural change a couple years ago that is clearly paying off. Instead of giving out ten, \$200 scholarships, we are now giving out four scholarships at \$500 each. This coupled with Kevin Reed being constantly on-the-ball with everything he runs, has increased applications exponentially. The old set up generally attracted about three or four applicants. This year, Kevin had 15.

The successes we've had last year are a testament to the notion that a little extra effort goes a long way. Now as I stated last year, I'm perfectly aware that not everyone is comfortable putting such a big focus on numbers. But let's remember, we're not just putting on events. We're not just filling seats in some random stadium, getting the crowd fired up for sake of our own egos. We're bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ to teenagers across Northwestern Ohio - hundreds of them. The organization we're a part of is in the business of bringing kids into and fostering a true relationship with Christ. To that end, I say, let's bring as many as we can.

Which brings me back to our theme for this year. . . Momentum.

What is one collective thing we achieved last year? Momentum.

What will bring us into another great year here in Northwestern Ohio? Momentum.

At this point, we are really rolling. Events and programs are going well, kids are excited and well informed, and we have returning leadership. That said, I don't want to make the mistake of assuming all is well. I don't want to miss any new ideas, or new developments taking place. So in the interest of keeping that momentum and capitalizing on it, I want to make it known that in addition to a continued push to increase our influence, this will also be a year of review and exploration. A time for looking at what we are doing, assessing it, and making any necessary changes. Nothing will be off the table.

In particular, here are some items on my radar screen. And while these items haven't necessarily been neglected in the past, I want to make an extra effort this year in certain areas.

1. Interdepartmentalism. I'm pretty sure this isn't a word, but if we all start using it, maybe Webster's Dictionary will pick it up. (And hopefully give us credit) The council is aware that I have been pushing for ways to work more closely with other district Auxiliaries. Sometimes it seems that the NYI is in its own little world and every now and then we make a phone call to another country. In Organizational Development, this is known as the silo effect. Different parts of the whole, tend to only see what is inside their own "silo." Now, I don't want to overdramatize the situation as I certainly believe everyone plays nicely on our district playground. But with just a little more collaboration, I think we could harness even more energy and creativity to achieve bigger things. And the NYI wants to be a part of that.

2. Administrative Help. The NYI budget each year is \$21,000. This is money that we are allocated from the district at large. But in order to get a more accurate picture of the scope of District NYI Ministries, one must also look at the collective expenses for all our events. When you factor in the operating budgets of Summer Camp, Fall Retreat, New Year's Revolution, District BLAST, Regional BLAST, Quizzing, NYC, One Heart Many Hands, and a few others, we are actually closing in on a budget of \$200,000. Any organization of that size has considerable accounting needs, advertising needs, paperwork needs, and record keeping needs - administrative items.

We've done well in the past to cover these through event directors and their assistants, but these folks are all volunteers, and this has its limits. If we are to achieve long-term sustainable quality and growth, some solid administrative help is needed. Without getting too much into the details, the NYI has attempted several solutions and floated many ideas, but so far have come up short. But I'm still looking for a solution.

3. Keeping a Customer focus. In the past we've done an excellent job keeping our eye on the ball. The NYI is in place to meet the needs of N.W.O. teenagers and local Church youth programs. And I think we are doing our job. But another item that business consultants warn against, is becoming too internally focused. Thus, sacrificing the good of one's customer for the good of the organization. This is somewhat of a naturally occurring event and classic examples can be seen throughout our Nation's history. In order for organizations to really thrive, they must actively press against this. The NYI is no different. This will be a year of asking ourselves "Why do we do what we do? If we had to do this all over again, would we still do it? And are our customer's better off because of our services?"

So . . . three main areas. . . interdepartmentalism, administrative help, and keeping a customer focus. A lot of this may sound like the talk of a businessman. . . but that's who I am. And you elected me. These are some of the items I see as needing to be looked at for the future of The District NYI. It's going to be fun.

Again, it's been a great year, and I anticipate more of the same in 2011 and 2012. In order to do that we need to be on a footing of a continued press ahead, coupled with a constant evaluation of what we are really doing.

## **2. Finance Committee**

### **1. District Support**

A. Budget Allocations: We recommend:

1. That in accordance with the Global Church formula, the base for funding the mission be local church income minus funds paid for World Evangelism Fund (WEF) and Approved Mission Specials.

2. That the World Evangelism Fund be 5.5 percent of the base.

3. That the Pension Fund be 2 percent of the base.

4. That the Mount Vernon Nazarene University Fund be 2.5 percent of the base.

5. That each local church be assigned the District Unified Fund, which includes District Operations, Mission Development Operations, Nazarene Center Operations, and the three auxiliary apportionments. The District Unified Fund, assigned by the District Advisory Board serving as the Finance Committee, is \$714,116, and that the individual operations be set as follows:

6. That the District Sunday School Ministries portion be \$23,150.

7. That the District NYI portion be \$21,000.

8. That the District NMI portion be \$14,060.

B. District Financial Policy: We recommend:

1. That all churches send WEF and Pension Fund percentages weekly to the Global Treasury Services, Church of the Nazarene, PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184-3116.

2. That the District Office collect the Mount Vernon Nazarene University (MVNU) Education Fund, and forward the money to MVNU.

3. That all churches send the Unified Fund assignment weekly to the District Office.

4. That all churches be assigned a portion of the Unified Fund, including new starts.

5. That all churches be encouraged to take advantage of electronic fund transfers for payment of both District and General Church funds. Use the District webpage (www.nwonaz.org) for access to the district funds site, and the Global Treasurer webpage for access to the General Church funds site.

6. That: (a) the District Treasurer be the collection agent for all district funds, including District Unified Funds, Sunday School Ministries, NYI, and District NMI. (b) all District financial records be audited by a Certified Public Accountant at the close of the year, and that the audit report, if not completed in time to present to the District Assembly, be presented to the District Advisory Board by their July meeting; (c) should any activity be established by the District Assembly which collects funds, the above procedure be followed; (d) the District Treasurer be bonded; (e) all savings, CD funds, and cash accounts will be maintained by the District Treasurer.

7 That the District Finance Committee assess the percent of the District Funds base for the NMI, Sunday School Ministries, and NYI. That a proposed budget from each auxiliary be submitted to the District Office prior to May 1 for the approval of the Finance Committee.

8. That the district pay .36 per mile and contingent expense for district committee meetings.

9 That electronic District Assembly Journals be accessed as needed by the local church at the Online Media Library on the General Church website.

10 That the District Superintendent be reimbursed directly for budgeted travel, entertainment and related expenses.

*II. Local Support*

A. Administrative Policies: We recommend:

1. That all local churches consider the following procedure for timely payment of Pension, Education, and District Funds: the total of these funds will be approximately 10% of weekly income, and can be presented to the congregation and paid using the "tithe concept". World Evangelism Fund can be raised in addition as in prior years through Faith Promise,

Easter Offering, and Thanksgiving Offering.

2. All churches should enter their finances each week on the website, [www.fundingthemission.org](http://www.fundingthemission.org).

3. That each church reach and exceed 10 percent giving for world mission through full payment of the World Evangelism Fund and Approved Special offerings. That no church be permitted to participate in Work/Witness unless the World Evangelism Fund is paid.

4. That all churches begin to formulate a local budget by March 1 and send a completed budget by June 1 to the District Superintendent.

5. That the church treasurer present a written financial report monthly to the pastor and church board.

6. That each church provide a committee that shall count and deposit all money in a bank or vault after each service (Manual, par. 129.22). That a minimum of three persons be present when money is counted. That the church treasurer shall not be included as one of the counters.

7. That an auditing committee audit or examine annually the financial records of the church (Manual, par. 129.23), and that all churches raising over \$100,000 for all purposes be encouraged to use the services of an outside auditor.

8. That when defining income for the local church, the guidelines and examples provided by the General Board on the website, [www.fundingthemission.org](http://www.fundingthemission.org) be consulted. Examples of Designated Gift policies and other items of assistance can also be found there.

9. In order to encourage a sound financial plan in light of the Biblical plan for "tithes and offerings" (Malachi 3:8-10) we encourage local churches to present a three-fold plan for giving: first the practice of storehouse tithing; second, Faith Promise--regular weekly or monthly giving above the tithe for missions and others; and third, expansion or building fund--monthly giving above one's tithe. Every growing church will need to give attention to remodeling or expansion.

B. Pastor and Ministerial Staff Support: We recommend:

1. That at the establishment of the annual budget, the local church board consider the senior pastor and ministerial staff remuneration at the annual rate of inflation and consider an additional merit raise. All adjustments must be reported to the District Superintendent by the church board secretary

2. That a well-maintained parsonage or a housing allowance be provided, and that all utilities be paid by the church. That each local church board should aggressively seek to become familiar with the unique tax consequences for pastors and the important benefits to the local church by a proper understanding and reporting of the pastor's housing fund/allowance. That each church board consult with a tax advisor familiar with church Internal Revenue Service regulations as to the most suitable way to construct his salary package.

3. That they be fully reimbursed for social security, currently 15.3%.

4. That hospital and surgical insurance benefits be carried on them, their family, and any full-time associates. The District's program may be used, if desired. That medical expense "deductible" be reimbursed.

5. That their car expense be considered and the church pay it as a local church expense.

6. That as their income tax filing is on an employer-employee basis, the church establish an accountable reimbursement policy according to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code in order that reimbursed expenses can be separated from gross income.

Churches are urged to also set up expense accounts for staff to adequately cover all church related expenses and reimburse when proper receipts and documentation are presented. Receipts for reimbursement must be presented no later than 60 days after the expense is incurred.

7. That each church pay their expenses to the District Assembly, the District Conventions, Ministers' and Mates' Conference, Pastors' Devotional Retreat, Women In Ministry Retreat, and PALCON, and as churches are able, that they cover the expenses of their pastor for all appropriate district, regional, and general church training.

8. That every church make financial preparations to send its pastor and wife to General Assembly by establishing a fund of at least 30.00 per month, and that the incumbent pastor at the time of General Assembly receive the monies from the fund. Each church should consider a plan to also send full-time associates to the General Assembly. This time is not to be considered vacation.

9. That the church send them to a seminar of their choosing at least once a year as part of their continuing education and this time not be considered vacation.

10. That the church board provide a book fund redeemable at the bookstore of their choosing.

11. That the guideline for their vacation be based on full-time service in the Church of the Nazarene as follows: up to 2 years of service, two weeks, including two Sundays; 2-6 years, three weeks, including three Sundays; for 6-15 years, four weeks, including four Sundays; for 15 or more years of service, five weeks with five Sundays.

12. That each local church provide a tax-free annuity for all full-time pastoral staff in addition to the present cash salary. That this annuity be an amount equal to, but not limited to, 5 percent (a minimum of \$500 per year) and not to exceed the maximum tax-sheltered annuity presently allowable by law. The Nazarene 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan or its equivalent should be used.

13. That each church consider paying the premium for their participation in the Nazarene Supplemental Group Term Life Insurance Program.

14. That in considering a Christmas gift for them, churches give the equivalent of at least one week's salary.

15. That each church pay Ohio Workers' Compensation for the pastor and staff and that the treasurer see that the proper form has been sent to enroll all ministerial staff. Check for information on the website, [www.ohiobwc.com](http://www.ohiobwc.com).

16. That each church consider supporting a sabbatical/study leave for the pastor during the seventh consecutive year of service in one congregation (Manual 129.10), with details to be worked out by the church board and the pastor.

17. That each church reevaluate its property and liability insurance at least every three years and if possible, annually, and report it to the district office.

### *III Evangelist's Support*

We recommend:

1. That each church board set a minimum financial remuneration for revival workers of at least two times the pastor's salary plus benefits for each Sunday of the meeting, plus travel one way, and notify the worker of the amount at the time of the call (Manual 129.11).

2. That as far as possible finances for the revival be raised before the workers arrive.

3. That the church give proper consideration for the care of the evangelist, including

the cost of meals and lodging.

4. That, as possible, the local church where tenured or commissioned evangelists and commissioned song evangelists hold their membership and support it with tithes and offerings, the evangelist be supported in some of the following ways:

- a. Pay the evangelist's expense to the District and General gatherings.
- b. Maintain their hospital and surgical benefits insurance.
- c. Reimburse the evangelist's Social Security.

5. That a suitable Christmas remembrance (\$50.00 minimum) be sent to evangelists who have served the church during the year.

6. That we encourage the use of our evangelists, ministerial college students, and retired elders for pulpit supply during the summer to supplement them.

7. That churches consider a one-day summer Sunday revival and use an evangelist for the day.

#### *IV. University Support*

We recommend:

1. That we encourage our local churches to establish a University Grant Program in which the church contributes up to \$1500 per Nazarene student per year to match a similar grant being given by the university.

2. That we encourage the 100% payment of the MVNU budget.

3. That we approve the matching funds program sponsored by Mount Vernon Nazarene University and urge our people to participate. It is understood that no portion of a matching corporation gift can be used to pay the university budget, unless expressly authorized by the matching gift corporation. Otherwise, all corporate matching gifts will go to the university for capital use or for scholarships. Each donor should check with his/her corporation on its matching gift policy.

4. That we encourage local churches to set up scholarship endowments with the university, the proceeds to be used for scholarships in the local churches.

#### *V. Summation Clause*

That the District Advisory Board have authorization to oversee and harmonize any like items not herein stated.

That each Church Board review sections II, III, and IV of this report each year at one of their meetings.

**B. NMI Convention  
PROCEEDINGS  
May 6, 2011**

The 52<sup>nd</sup> Nazarene Mission International Convention of the Northwestern Ohio District began at 7:00 o'clock on Friday evening, May 6, 2011, at the district center in St. Marys, Ohio. Kristi Payne, Northwestern Ohio District NMI president, welcomed friends, delegates and guests and gave information concerning the workshops for presidents and children's and youth workers to be held on Saturday morning. She also announced the Kids' Konvention to be held on Saturday. Teens and children were encouraged to stay for pizza following the service, while the adults were invited to have refreshments in the foyer.

Delegates and friends sat around tables as Bret Layton led the congregation in prayer. After viewing "Cambodia," a music video by Leeland and Brandon Heath, Kristi Payne presented the convention theme, "On the Way," by reading Mark 8:27-29. She challenged those present to tell people who Jesus is "on the way," as we go on the journey of our lives. Dave Dooley and the band from Kenton Church of the Nazarene led the worship service with a variety of praise and worship songs.

After watching a video, "Aiden's Well," Kristi Payne further explained the project of building a well in Malawi. The project is the vision of Aiden Loggett, age 10, from Hope Community Church in Oregon, Ohio.

Two teams of volunteers played "NMI Minute to Win It." With each round, everyone learned facts about Alabaster, LINKS, Work and Witness and Crisis Care Kits.

A video, "Africa," was viewed and missionaries were introduced. The Missionary works from the Africa Regional Office and is the Church Multiplication and Development Facilitator. He spoke of the explosive growth in the Church of the Nazarene in the Horn of Africa in the past 11 years, going from 200 Nazarenes to over 200,000. He and his wife Bev spoke of miraculous healings and conversions taking place in Africa, using Matthew 16:18 as their scriptural reference. "...I will build my church and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." He concluded by saying, "Nothing can stop Jesus from building His church!"

Kristi Payne closed the service with prayer.

Saturday Morning, May 7, 2011

At the close of the Presidents' Workshop and the children and youth workers informational gathering, District NMI President, Kristi Payne, welcomed friends and delegates to the 52<sup>nd</sup> NMI Convention of the Northwestern Ohio District. She opened with prayer and made announcements.

Pastor Dave Dooley from the Kenton Church of the Nazarene led the congregation in worship.

Missionaries spoke again of the work in Africa, using the same scripture from the night before, Matthew 16:18. They spoke of God's protection and healing and of phenomenal church growth and church planting. He again stated that nothing (economics, Muslims, witch doctors) can stop Jesus from building His church! He challenged everyone in the congregation to give testimony about Jesus, not just about the church or our pastor.

Marianne McCord, Children and Youth Connection Coordinator, announced that the children's mission project for this year will be Aiden's Well. It costs \$8000 to build a well in Malawi. The kick-off offering would be taken at the convention and the results made known in the afternoon session. Depending on the size of the offering, Kristi Payne would be allowed certain items (goggles, waders, rain coat, swim ring and umbrella) to keep dry when the children splash her following the convention! The children were dismissed for Kids Konvention held during the business sessions.

President Kristi Payne called the business session to order. A motion was made and seconded to organize the convention. Joan Davidson, district NMI secretary, named the following assistants: pages—Megan Payne and Minda Wott; recording secretary—Mary Jo Ledyard; elections secretary—Barb Gibbs. One board of tellers was named. Alternates were seated by common consent. The special order of the day was set for 10:40 am.

Kristi Payne recognized the following special guests: missionaries, Mona Kunselman, wife of the District Superintendent and Lola Brickey, Regional NMI Representative. Lola Brickey addressed the convention. Letters of greeting were received from Dr. Dan Ketchum, General NMI Director, Kevin and Joan Brunk, and Steve and Rachel Beiler.

The chair was yielded to the District Superintendent, Rev. Geoff Kunselman, who presented Kristy for her fifth report as NMI president. She spoke of having made the decision not to run for re-election this year and then how God intervened for her and her family and allowed her to continue ministering where her passion lies. She asked that scheduling and hosting missionaries remain a priority for the district. She reported that over 200 children attended the Mission Jamboree in October and that the children's project raised over \$10,000 for Kids Helping Kids. The Northwestern Ohio District has again made 100% payment of the World Evangelism Fund. 1040 School Pal-Paks were prepared along with 1,380 Crisis Care Kits, record numbers for both. A highlight of the year was the Work and Witness project that sent 6 teams totaling 190 people from 18 churches for 6 weeks to Cherokee, North Carolina. Kristy gave thanks to NW Ohio leaders- Rev. Kunselman, pastors and NMI presidents. She concluded her report by again reading Mark 8:27 "...On the way he asked them, 'Who do people say that I am?'" He asked them this question so that they could inform themselves and then inform others who Jesus is. A video was shown with people's answer to the question, "Who is Jesus?" We must know who Jesus is so that we can share Him with others. We are on our way on this journey. It will mean nothing if we cannot answer Jesus' question with, "You are the Christ." She challenged the delegates to make every single minute count for the kingdom. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Approval was voted. Jackie Blough presented a Distinguished Service Award and a gift of appreciation to Kristy.

Rev. Kunselman gave the report of the nominating committee stating that Kristi Payne would run on a yes or no ballot for a 2 year term. Ballots were distributed to the delegates.

Jackie Blough gave the treasurer's report. After a motion was made and seconded, the report was accepted.

Joan Davidson reviewed the convention CD and Calendar.

Rev. Paul Jetter presented the Pastors & Spouses Work and Witness trip to Honduras January 23-30. Rev. Kunselman urged local NMI presidents to help their pastors go on W&W trips.

Kristi Payne presented Mary Jetter with a Distinguished Service Award for her years of service as Mission Call Coordinator. Mary is stepping down from this position. Local presidents and pastors were asked to make the council aware of anyone they feel would be able to fill this spot.

Mike Griffith and friends, Brothers Found, ministered in music.

Missionaries were introduced to speak for the last time to the convention. Continuing to use Matthew 16:18, they spoke of protection from fire, the power of prayer and deliverance from those who sought to take the lives of missionaries. The missionary spoke about the kind of disciples Christ will use to build His church. He will use ones who will deny themselves and take up their crosses. Christ is saying, "I will build my church by the testimony of my 'dead-to-themselves' disciples." He left the convention with this question- If we don't go (or give or pray), where will they spend eternity?

The morning session was adjourned to reconvene at 1:30 pm.

#### Afternoon Session

After the convention was reconvened, Joan Davidson read the results of the NMI District President ballot. Total ballots cast: 285. Yes: 283, No: 2. Kristi Payne was declared elected.

Kristi recognized local NMI presidents for a job well done.

Dave Dooley led in praise music.

The Convention offering was taken. The offering is to be used for project money for the district W&W trip to Jordan in 2012.
